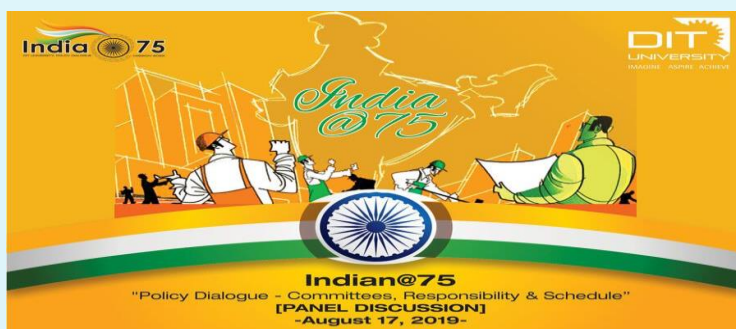

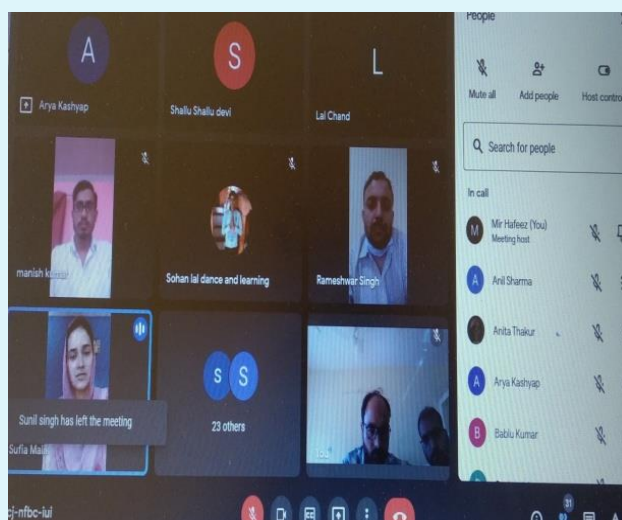
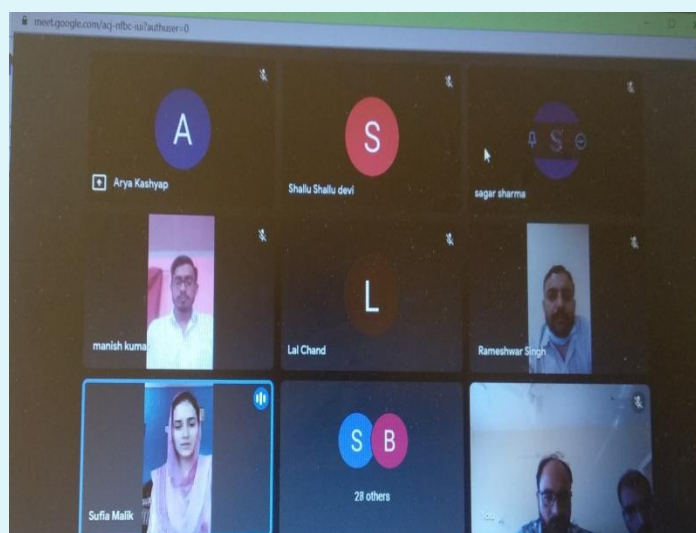

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### **ONLINE INTRA-COLLEGE AWARENESS PROGRAMME FOR IMPLEMENTING NEW INDIA @ 75 (PHASE 2<sup>ND</sup>)**

Govt. Degree College, Chenani under the auspices of its Red Ribbon Club and in collaboration with the J&K AIDS Control Society organised an online intra-College programme on HIV awareness and its prevention on 13/10/2021 at 11:00 AM to celebrate AZADI KA AMRIT MOHATSAV and for implementing New India @75.

The event was organised to create awareness among the students on burning issue of AIDS, its causes, prevention and its early diagnosis. The event was launched under motto KNOW AIDS for NO AIDS.

Dr. Pragya Khanna, Principal of the College presented the inaugural address in which she highlighted the background to mark the event. She reflected that thousands of people are infected and children are being orphaned worldwide because of HIV/AIDS. Since there is actually no cure for HIV/AIDS, the best we can do to prevent this disease from spreading and taking more lives is to educate the masses and create awareness. She further said that organising such HIV awareness programmes in India can provide an opportunity to educate the community about prevention, research and HIV testing; the human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) has emerged as the single most formidable challenge to public health and development in the new millennium in India and spreading knowledge and awareness about HIV can be the best strategy which can be utilised in averting and monitoring the spread of HIV/AIDS in India.

A total of 100 students took part in the awareness programme. Mr. Sohan Lal, a student of BA semester V presented a PowerPoint presentation on HIV, its signs and symptoms. He explained in detail the transmission of HIV and elaborated the risk factors associated with it, Ms. Arya Kashyap student of BA semester V presented a presentation on AIDS its epidemiology, HIV transmission and several routes of transmission of HIV. Ms. Sufia Khatoon student of BA semester III elaborated the diagnosis, prevention and treatment of HIV. Mr. Manish Kumar, student of BA



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semester V also gave a presentation on social effects of the disease. He discussed HIV infection in detail and also highlighted the pathogenesis, treatment, prevention and scope of AIDS vaccine.

Dr. Mudasir Abdullah, HOD, Education presented the formal vote of thanks. The programme was organised by Mr. Hafeez Ahmad Mir, Assistant Professor in Political Science and Dr. Rameashwar Singh HOD Mathematics.

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### ONLINE INTRA-COLLEGE SLOGAN /POSTER MAKING COMPETITION ON TB AWARENESS

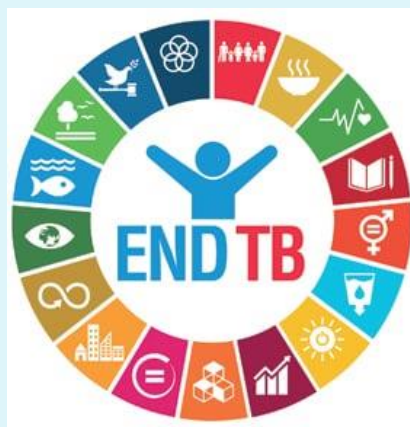
An online intra-college slogan and poster making competition on TB awareness was organized on 14/10/2021.

The event was organized to create awareness among the students on Tuberculosis as TB remains as a serious health problem in India. Awareness about the disease, its diagnosis and treatment among the public shall help in controlling the killer disease. India as we know has the highest burden of Tuberculosis in the world, an estimated two million cases annually.

Dr. Pragya Khanna, Principal of the College in her address said that we must spread awareness about tuberculosis in the community and we don't have to worry or get in to panic state when we hear a person has been diagnosed with TB as with the latest advancement in the medicine, tuberculosis is now curable. She further stated that majority of people are hesitant of consulting doctors, however, they should take full advantage of the government provided screening services and free dose of medication to all people suffering from tuberculosis. She elaborated the symptoms of tuberculosis in detail and highlighted the preventive measures and its early diagnosis.

A total number of 35 students took part in the competition and with colors they depicted their talent and artistic expressions.

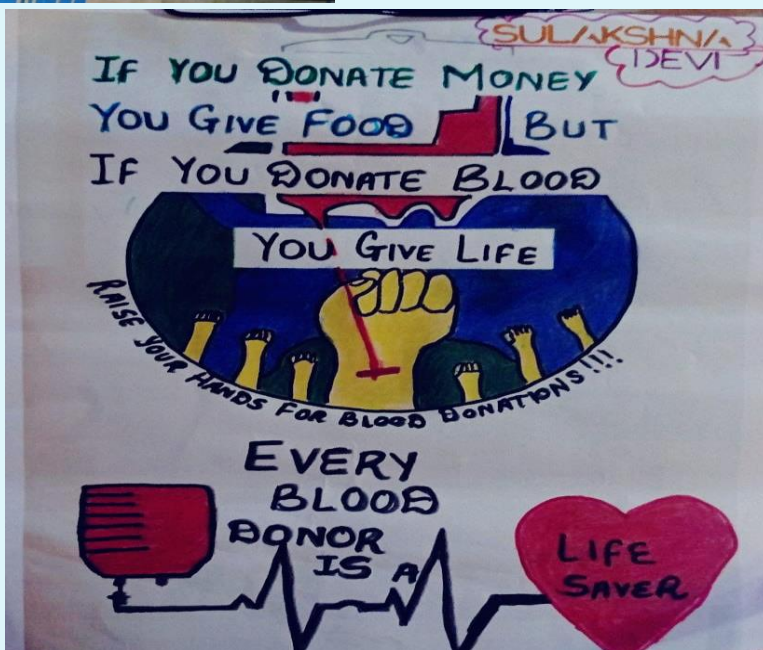

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### ONLINE INTRA-COLLEGE POSTER MAKING COMPETITION ON BLOOD DONATION

An online intra college poster making competition on blood donation in collaboration with National AIDS Control Organization, Govt. of India and Jammu and Kashmir AIDS Control Society was organized on 18/10/2021 for implementing new India @75 2nd phase.

The event was organized to spread awareness about the significance of blood donation and to recognize the contribution of voluntary unpaid blood donors in saving the precious lives. As we know safe blood and blood products and their transfusion are critical aspects of care and public health as they save hundred thousands of lives. The event was aimed to raise awareness among the students for safe blood and blood products for transfusion and an opportunity to call to action for government to put in place the systems and infrastructure to increase the collection of blood from voluntary, non-remunerated blood donors.

Dr. Pragya Khanna, Principal of the College stated in her address that blood transfusion is an important concern for the society, as it is life saving for patients with bleeding disorders, accidents, surgeries, hematological problems and malignancies. She opined that voluntary non-remunerated blood donors are the cornerstone of a safe adequate supply of blood and blood components. She further stated that amid the corona virus pandemic it is crucial to consider to donate blood as the covid-19 has affected blood donation drives which has further resulted in reduced stocks of blood and its components. She appealed all the NSS volunteers and students of the college to participate in blood donation and to play any important role in saving the precious lives.

A total of 40 students took part in the poster making competition.

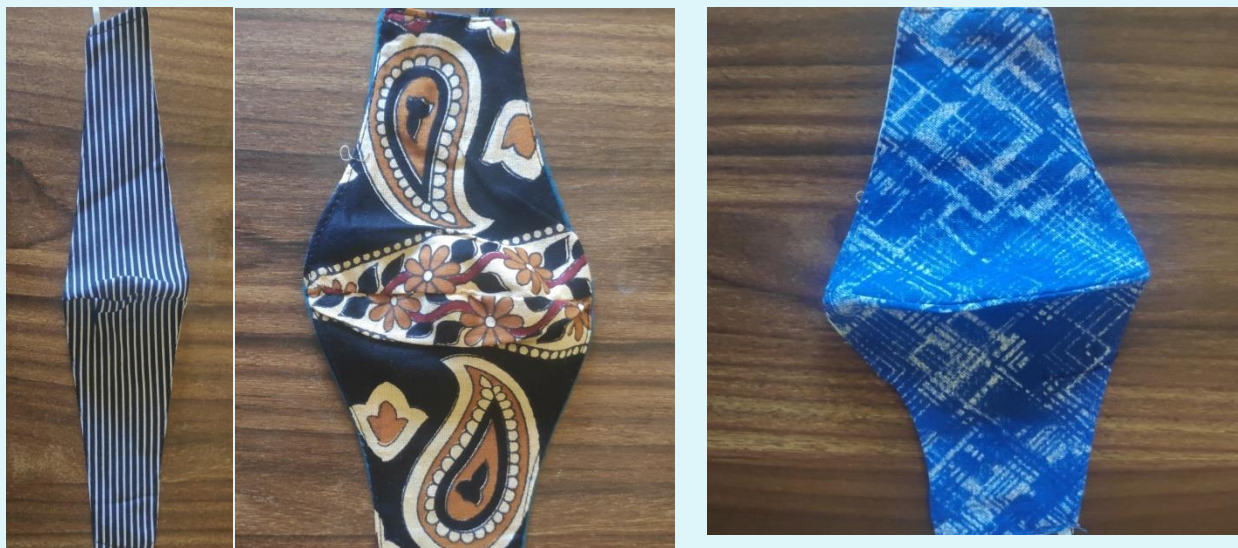
